- ✓ Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport (ATL) has topped the 2021 Rankings with 7.6 crore passengers in terms of passenger footfall in the year 2021.
- ✓ From India, the Indira Gandhi International (IGI) Airport in New Delhi has been ranked among the top 20, as the 13th busiest airport. IGIA witnessed 3.7 crore passengers footfall in 2021, which is 30.3% more than 2.8 crore in 2020, when IGI was ranked 16th.
- ✓ The list of top 20 busiest airport represents 19% of global traffic (863 million passengers).
- ✓ The ranking provides a view of air transport demand across the world's airports in three areas: passengers (international and domestic), air cargo (freight and mail) and aircraft movements (air transport movements and general aviation).
- ✓ Airports Council International (ACI) Established in 1991, its headquarters (ACI World) are based in Montreal, Quebec, Canada.

- ✓ Karikili Bird Sanctuary: Karikili Bird Sanctuary is a 61.21-hectare protected area located in the Kancheepuram District of Tamil Nadu.
- ✓ Pallikaranai Marsh Reserve Forest : Pallikaranai wetland is a freshwater marsh located in Chennai, Tamil Nadu.
- ✓ **Pichavaram Mangrove :** Pichavaram mangrove is located in a village near Chidambaram in Cuddalore District of Tamil Nadu
- ✓ Pala wetland : The Pala wetland is the largest natural wetland in Mizoram.



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- ✓ **Sakhya Sagar**: Sakhya Sagar Lake is an integral part of the beautiful ecology of the Madhav National Park in Shivpuri, Madhya Pradesh.
- ✓ What are Ramsar Sites
- ✓ A Ramsar Site is a wetland site designated to be of international importance under the Ramsar Convention. The name Ramsar comes from Ramsar City of Iran, where this treaty was signed.
- ✓ The Convention on Wetlands is also known as the Ramsar Convention. It is an intergovernmental environmental treaty established in 1971 by UNESCO and came into force in 1975.
- ✓ Wetlands declared as Ramsar sites are protected under strict guidelines of the convention.
- ✓ The aim of the Ramsar list is to develop and maintain an international network of wetlands which are important for the conservation of global biological diversity and for sustaining human life through the maintenance of their ecosystem components, processes and benefits.

- India signed the Ramsar Convention on 1 February 1982.
- Sundarban wetlands are the largest Ramsar site in India.
- > Chilika Lake (Orissa) and Keoladeo National Park (Rajasthan) were recognized as the first Ramsar Sites of India.
- Uttar Pradesh has the highest number of 10 Ramsar sites in India.
- > Renuka Wetland in Himachal Pradesh is the smallest wetland of India.
- Chilka lake and Keoladeo Ghana National Park is the oldest Ramsar site in India which was declared in 1981.
- World's First Ramsar site was identified in 1974, which was the Cobourg Peninsula in Australia.
- ➤ The United Kingdom has the world's largest number of Ramsar Sites i.e. 175.
- Bolivia has the largest area under Ramsar protection.

- ✓ AR Rahman unveils anthem 'Vanakkam Chennai' for 44th International Chess Olympiad.
- ✓ The All India Chess Federation (AICF) on signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the
  Tamil Nadu government for the forthcoming 44th Chess Olympiad, slated to be held here from July 28
  to August 10.
- ✓ Prime Minister Narendra Modi has launched the historic torch relay for the 44th Chess Olympiad at Indira Gandhi Stadium in New Delhi.
- ✓ A record 187 countries will participate in the event, making it the world's biggest chess event.
- ✓ A total of 188 teams in the Open section and 162 in the Women's section will participate in the Olympiad.
- ✓ From India, total 30 Indian players will take part across six teams (Three in open and three women).
- ✓ The main venue of the Chess Olympiad will be the convention centre at the Four Points by Sheraton, while the opening and closing ceremonies will be held at the Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium (also known as the Marina Arena) Chennai.

Transmission can also occur from contaminated materials such as linens, bedding, electronics, clothing, that have infectious skin particles
