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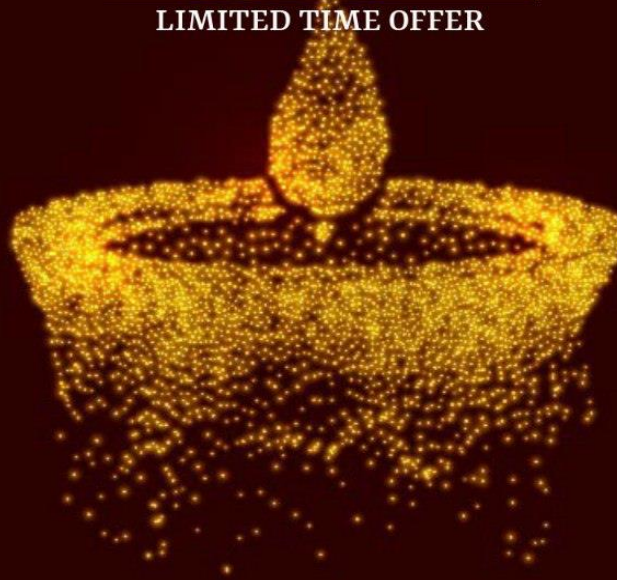

- ✓ Bihar, Jharkhand, and Maharashtra are Partner States while Uttar Pradesh and Kerala are participating as Focus States in the fair.
- ✓ Various Central Ministries, Departments, Commodity Boards, and PSUs are participating in this event to showcase their achievements.
- ✓ 12 foreign countries including Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bahrain, Belarus, Iran, Nepal, Thailand, Turkey, UAE, and UK are participating in the fair

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- ✓ The Union government, through the Inland Waterways Authority of India, has signed an MoU with Cochin Shipyard for the construction of the vessel.
- ✓ CSL has also signed an MoU for the construction of six electric catamaran vessels for Uttar Pradesh and another two for Guwahati in Assam.
- ✓ The hydrogen fuel cell catamaran vessel will have a seating capacity for 100 passengers.
- ✓ The electric hybrid vessels, designed for short-distance commute in riverine waters, will have seating capacity for 50 passengers.

- ✓ MMLP at Chennai which is strategically located about 52 km from Chennai Port, 80 km from Ennore Port, 87 km from Katupalli Airport will be a focal point of logistics in the southern region.
- ✓ Ministry of Road Transport and Highways has announced that MMLP will be spread over 184 acres and cost Rs 1,424 crore

- ✓ 'Prasthan' is conducted twice a year under the aegis of Headquarters, Western Naval Command.
- ✓ It aims to assess various measures and protocols conceived to address security threats and other contingencies that may arise in offshore oil production platforms.
- ✓ Partner agencies such as the Indian Navy, Indian Air Force, Indian Coast Guard, ONGC, Mumbai Port Authority (MbPA), the police, fisheries, and customs activated their emergency procedures to deal with the contingencies.

- ✓ The first Kabaddi World Cup was held in Melaka, Malaysia in July 2019. The men's and women's title was won by the Indian team.

- ✓ The remaining two teams will be identified through the 10-team ICC Women's T20 World Cup Global Qualifier

- ✓ After the Indian Parliament passed the Bihar Reorganization Act, 2000, Jharkhand was carved out of Bihar on November 15, 2000.
- ✓ Jharkhand's state animal is the Indian elephant while the state bird is Koel.
- ✓ The state's capital is Ranchi.
- ✓ Jharkhand is also called 'The land of the forest' or 'Bushland'.
- ✓ Right now, the forests of Chhotanagpur plateau and Santhal Pargana make up Jharkhand.



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- ✓ It is the 15th largest state based on its area size.
- ✓ One of the fascinating folk dance forms of Jharkhand that is quite popular is 'Chhau nach', a masked dance performance that is a great visual treat.
- ✓ The state is rich in mineral resources like coal, iron ore, copper ore, uranium, mica, bauxite, granite, limestone, silver, and dolomite.
- ✓ While Ranchi is its capital city, Dumka is Jharkhand's sub-capital
