- ✓ Goan cashew (Fruit and Nut) was recently granted the geographical indication (GI) tag.
- ✓ Goan cashew derived from the Portuguese name 'caju' or 'kaju' in Konkani.
- ✓ Evolution of Cashews in Goa
- ✓ Originally, it was native to northeast Brazil in Latin America.
- ✓ It was introduced by the Portuguese in the 16th century (1570).
- ✓ Initially, it was known mainly as a crop for afforestation and soil conservation.
- ✓ According to research, the 1st cashew factory in Goa started operations in 1926.
- ✓ By 1961, the cashew processing industry accounted for about 60% of industrial production in Goa, a bulk of which was exported.

### **GI TAG IN NEWS 2023**

- Goan cashew (Fruit and Nut) was recently granted the geographical indication (GI) tag.
- ➤ Basohli Pashmina, a more than 100-year-old traditional craft from Jammu and Kashmir's Kathua district, has got the Geographical Indication (GI) tag.
- > Tamil Nadu's Salem Sago gets GI tag.
- ➤ Bhaderwah Rajmash and Sulai honey of Doda and Ramban districts of Jammu and Kashmir, have been granted Geographical Indication (GI) tags.
- ➤ Chokuwa rice of Assam recently earned a GI (Geographical Indication) tag for its exquisiteness.
- > The Matti banana variety, native to Kanniyakumari district was recently granted the Geographical Indication (GI) tag.
- Mushkbudji rice, which was granted the GI tag along with eight other products from Jammu and Kashmir
- Tamil Nadu's Authoor betel leaves get Geographical Indication (GI) certificate.

- Geographical Indications Registry, in June 2023, accorded the Geographical Indication (GI) tag to the Kari Ishad mango predominantly grown in Ankola taluk of Uttara Kannada in Karnataka.
- Mircha rice variety from West Champaran district of Bihar has recently been granted the GI tag.
- > The products included are Tandur red gram of Telangana, gamocha of Assam, Alibag white onion of Maharashtra, and Raktsey Karpo apricot of Ladakh among others.
- After getting GI tag for three more One District One Product (ODOP) crafts, Uttar Pradesh has now come second in the country in terms of maximum number of items with Geographical Indication tag.
- > The ODOP crafts which have got GI tag include Mainpuri Tarkashi, Mahoba Gaura Stone Craft and Sambhal Horn Craft.
- Ladakh wood carvings, also known as 'Ladakh Shingskos', have been granted the Geographical Indication (GI) tag.
- > The GI tag was granted to Tamil Nadu's famous Cumbum Paneer Thirachai, also known as Cumbum Grapes.
- > Gond paintings from Madhya Pradesh have bagged the Geographical Indication (GI) tag.
- ➤ Banarasi paan has been awarded the GI tag, which signifies its unique identity and origin. Three other foods from the Varanasi region, including Banarasi Langda Mango, Ramnagar Bhanta (Brinjal), and Adamchini rice, have also received the GI tag.
- Chhattisgarh's Nagri Dubraj rice variety gets geographical indication tag.
- > Gamocha', a symbol of the culture and identity of Assam, has received the Geographical Indication (GI) tag.
- > European Commission (EC) has recently granted Protected Geographical Indication (PGI) status to Kangra tea, aunique variety of tea grown in the Kangra district of Himachal Pradesh in India.
- The Central Government has granted Geographical Indication (GI) tag to Mithila Makhana, Bihar.
- ➤ GEOGRAPHICAL INDICATIONS (GI) :-
- ➤ GI tags are issued as per the Geographical Indications of Goods (Registration and Protection) Act,1999. This tag is issued by the Geographical Indication Registry under the Department of Industry Promotion and Internal Trade, Ministry of Commerce and Industry.
- > Darjeeling Tea was the first Indian product to get the geographical indication tag in 2004.
- > The second GI tag in India was given to Aranmula Kannadi (Handicraft) which is a mirror and made in Kerala.

- A GI is registered for an initial period of ten years, which must be renewed after 10 years.
- > Kerala has topped among Indian states for having most number of products securing the Geographical Indication (GI) tag in financial year 2022-23.
- ➤ What is GI tag?
- A GI is a sign used on products that have a specific geographical origin and possess qualities or a reputation that are due to that origin.

- ✓ Reserve Bank of India (RBI) recently extended the Payments Infrastructure Development Fund (PIDF) scheme by another two years and will include beneficiaries of the PM Vishwakarma scheme.
- ✓ About Payments Infrastructure Development Fund (PIDF) Scheme:
- ✓ It was first launched by the RBI in January 2021 for a period of three years.
- ✓ Objective: Increasing the number of payment acceptance devices multifold in the country.
- ✓ PIDF is a fund set up by the RBI, in consultation with major authorised card networks, to facilitate the development of payment acceptance infrastructure in tier-3 to tier-6 cities and the north-eastern states of India.
- The Union Territories of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh will also be given special focus.
- Beneficiaries of the PM SVANidhi Scheme in Tier-1 and 2 centres were later included in August 2021.

- ✓ Funding:
- ✓ The PIDF is funded by the RBI and the major authorized card networks in India.
- ✓ The scheme provides financial assistance to banks and non-bank financial companies (NBFCs) for the deployment of PoS terminals and other payment acceptance infrastructure in eligible regions.
- ✓ The PIDF will be governed through an Advisory Council and managed and administered by the RBI.
- ✓ The implementation of targets shall be monitored by the RBI with assistance from card networks, the Indian Banks' Association (IBA) and the Payments Council of India (PCI).
- ✓ What is PM Vishwakarma scheme?
- ✓ It is a Central Sector Scheme launched on 17th September, 2023, with a financial outlay of Rs.13,000 crore.
- ✓ Time period: Five years (FY 2023-24 to FY 2027-28).
- ✓ Aim:
- ✓ This initiative supports small businesses, focusing on traditional artists and craftspeople.
- ✓ It provides small workers and craftsmen with financial help, training, improved methods, and skill mentoring.
- ✓ It also aims at improving the quality as well as the reach of the products and services of artisans and craftsmen
- ✓ Under this scheme, the artisans and craftspeople will be provided recognition through the PM Vishwakarma certificate and ID card, credit support upto 1 lakh (first tranche) and Rs.2 lakh (second tranche), with a concessional interest rate of 5%

- ✓ As per the decision, a family with a yellow and saffron ration card will receive Rs 5000 after the birth of a girl child, Rs 6000 after she is enrolled in standard first, Rs 7000 after the sixth standard, Rs 8000 after standard 11 and Rs 75,000 after completing 18 years of age.

- ✓ The girl child will be benefited from Rs 1.01 lakh in total after completion of 18 years," said the official who attended the cabinet meeting. The scheme will be applicable for the child born after April 1, 2023.
- ✓ The scheme is meant to promote the birth of a girl child, and her education and to stop child marriage and malnutrition

- ✓ Intensified Mission Indradhanush (IMI 5.0), the flagship routine immunization campaign of the Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare will conclude all 3 rounds on 14th October 2023. IMI 5.0 ensures that routine immunization services reach the missed-out and dropped out children and pregnant women across the country. This year, for the first time the campaign is being conducted across all the districts in the country and includes children up to 5 years of age (Previous campaigns included children up to 2 years of age).
- ✓ IMI 5.0 campaign aims to enhance immunization coverage for all vaccines provided under the Universal Immunization Programme (UIP) as per the National Immunization Schedule (NIS). Special focus is on

improvement of Measles and Rubella vaccination coverage with the aim of Measles & Rubella elimination by 2023 and use of U-WIN digital platform for Routine Immunization in pilot mode across all districts in the country.

- ✓ IMI 5.0 is being conducted in three rounds i.e., 7-12 August, 11-16 September, and 9-14 October 2023 i.e., 6 days in a month with the inclusion of a Routine Immunization Day. All States/UTs except Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Odisha and Punjab would conclude all the three rounds of IMI 5.0 campaign by 14th October 2023. These four states could not start the IMI 5.0 campaign in August due to some inevitable circumstances. These states have concluded 1st round and are currently conducting the 2nd round. They plan to conduct the 3rd round of IMI 5.0 campaign in the month of November 2023.
- ✓ As on 30th September 2023, over 34,69,705 children and 6,55,480 pregnant women were administered vaccine doses during the first 2 rounds of IMI 5.0 campaign across the country.

- ✓ The Baiga are an ethnic group in central India. They are one of the Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs).
- ✓ The Baiga live in the following states:Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Bihar, Odisha, West Bengal.
- ✓ They have sub-castes Bijhwar, Narotia, Bharotiya, Nahar, Rai Bhaina, and Kadh Bhaina.

- ✓ What is a Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Group (PVTG)?
- ✓ PVTGs are most vulnerable among the tribal groups. Due to this factor, more developed and assertive tribal groups take a major chunk of the tribal development funds, because of which PVTGs need more funds directed for their development.
- ✓ In this context, in 1975, the Government of India declared 52 tribal groups as PVTGs on the recommendation of Dhebar commission.
- ✓ Currently, there are 75 PVTGs out of 705 Scheduled Tribes.
- ✓ The PVTGs are spread over 18 states and one UT, in the country (2011 census).
- ✓ Odisha has the highest number (more than 2.5 lakh) of PVTGs.
