- ✓ By 2022, the size of Indian GDP had already become larger than the GDP of the UK and also France.
- ✓ India is currently estimated to be the fifth largest economy with a GDP of \$3.7 trillion.
- ✓ Several estimates show that India's GDP is expected to overtake Japan and Germany by 2030. According to the Ratings agency S&P, India's nominal GDP will rise from \$3.4 trillion in 2022 to \$7.3 trillion by 2030.
- ✓ This rapid pace of economic expansion would result in the size of the Indian GDP, making India the second largest economy in the Asia-Pacific region.
- ✓ What will be Included in the Vision India@2047?
- ✓ The exercise to draw up the Vision India@2047 document was started in (December) 2021.
- ✓ 10 groups of secretaries across sectors such as rural and agriculture, infrastructure, social vision, welfare, technology, governance, security, foreign affairs, etc., were constituted for the purpose.
- ✓ The document will outline the structural changes and reforms needed to reach the objective of becoming a 30-trillion dollars developed economy by 2047 with a per-capita income of \$18,000-20,000.
- ✓ It will also have details about creating human capital to achieve the vision, how to leverage the country's market size and how to address regional disparities.
- ✓ The vision document will also detail the roadmap where India will be in 2030 and in 2047

- ✓ The economy will need to post an annual average economic growth of 9.2% between 2030-2040, 8.8% between 2040-2047 and 9% between 2030 to 2047.
- ✓ The preliminary results predict that India's exports will be valued at \$8.67 trillion in 2047 while its imports will be valued at \$12.12 trillion.
- ✓ India's apex policy think tank (Niti Aayog) also predicts India's average life expectancy to jump to 71.8 from 67.2 in 2021 and its literacy rate to 89.8% from 77.8% in 2021.

- ✓ Varaha is ocean mining vehicle which is a part of Deep Ocean Mission which is also called as Samudrayaan Mission
- ✓ It is a self-propelled track-based seabed mining system and operates on the flexible riser technique.

- ✓ Flexible riser is a class of flexible pipes which is used to connect subsea pipelines to floating offshore installations.
- ✓ Varaha is lowered to the ocean bed from a surface ship using a high-strength flexible cord system.
- ✓ Once the vehicle reaches the ocean bed, it will be able to move around while the surface ship moves in tandem.
- ✓ It uses a high-power pressure pump system to facilitate the extraction of precious polymetallic nodules. These nodules are pumped from the ocean bed to the surface ship
- ✓ Last year (2022) National Institute of Ocean Technology (NIOT) successfully conducted deep-sea locomotion trials of 'Varaha' at a depth of 5,270 m in the central Indian Ocean.
- ✓ Over a span of 2.5 hours, the surface ship covered a distance of 120 m with Varaha.
- ✓ This achievement marked the world's deepest dive for an underwater mining machine.
- ✓ According to the Ministry of Earth Science, the Samudrayaan Mission is expected to be realised by year 2026.
- ✓ What is Samudrayaan Mission?
- ✓ About:
- ✓ The mission is aimed at sending three personnel to 6000-metre depth in a vehicle called 'MATSYA 6000' for the exploration of deep-sea resources like minerals.
- ✓ 'MATSYA 6000' vehicle is being designed and developed by National Institute of Ocean Technology (NIOT), Chennai under Ministry of Earth Sciences.
- ✓ It has an endurance of 12 hours under normal operation and 96 hours in case of emergency for human safety.
- ✓ It is India's first unique manned ocean mission and is a part of the Rs 6000-crores Deep Ocean Mission.
- ✓ It will also boost the Central government's vision of 'New India' that highlights the Blue Economy as one of the ten core dimensions of growth

- ✓ This was formerly known as the Nayef Al-Rodhan Prize.
- ✓ It was established in 2013.
- ✓ It was established to reward and celebrate the best works of non-fiction that demonstrate rigour and originality and have contributed to public understanding of other world cultures and their interactions.
- ✓ The British Academy is the UK's national academy for humanities and social sciences.
- ✓ The eligible books come from the subjects that fall within those disciplines, from archaeology, history, and psychology to philosophy, languages, and cultural studies.

- ✓ PM Vishwakarma Scheme
- ✓ About:
- ✓ The scheme is designed to uplift traditional artisans and craftspeople engaged in various occupations like blacksmithing, goldsmithing, pottery, carpentry, and sculpting, with a focus on preserving cultural heritage and integrating them into the formal economy and global value chains.
- ✓ It will be implemented as a Central Sector Scheme, fully funded by the Government of India.
- ✓ Ministry:
- ✓ Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MoMSME) is the Nodal Ministry for the Scheme.
- ✓ The Scheme will be jointly implemented by the MoMSME, the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship and the Department of Financial Services, Ministry of Finance, Government of India.
- ✓ Features:
- ✓ Recognition and Support: Artisans and craftspeople enrolled in the scheme will receive a PM Vishwakarma certificate and an identity card.
- ✓ They will also be eligible for collateral-free credit support of up to Rs 1 lakh (first tranche) and Rs 2 lakh (second tranche) at a concessional interest rate of 5%.



- ✓ Skill Development and Empowerment: The Scheme has been allocated a budget ranging from Rs 13,000 crore for five financial years from 2023-2024 to 2027-2028.
- ✓ The scheme offers a stipend of Rs 500 for skill training per day and Rs 15,000 grant for the purchase of modern tools.
- ✓ **Scope and Coverage:** The scheme encompasses 18 traditional trades across both rural and urban areas
- ✓ **Registration and Implementation:** Registration for the Vishwakarma Yojana can be completed at common services centers in villages.
- ✓ Objectives:
- ✓ To ensure that artisans are seamlessly integrated into both domestic and global value chains, thus enhancing their market access and opportunities.
- ✓ Preservation and promotion of India's rich cultural heritage of traditional crafts.
- ✓ Assisting artisans in transitioning to the formal economy and integrating them into global value chains.
- ✓ Significance:
- ✓ Vishwakarmas (Traditional Artisans) play a critical role in society regardless of technological advancements.
- ✓ There is a need to recognize and support these artisans and integrate them into the global supply chain.
- ✓ The scheme encompasses 18 traditional trades across both rural and urban areas

- ✓ RITES Ltd, a prominent Central Public Sector Enterprise (CPSE) under the Ministry of Railways, has achieved the prestigious 'Navratna' status, becoming the 16th CPSE in India to be granted this distinction.
- ✓ IRCON International Limited (IRCON) and RITES Limited (RITES), both Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) under the Ministry of Railways, have been declared as the 15th and 16th Navratna respectively among the Central Public Sector Undertakings (CPSEs).
- ✓ These enterprises of the Railway Ministry have been given Navratna status by the Union Finance Ministry on 12 October 2023.
- ✓ About Navratna Status:
- ✓ The government categorises all Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) into three categories, namely Maharatna, Navratna, and Miniratna.
- ✓ Criteria to grant Navratna status:
- ✓ To get Navratna status, the PSU should be a Miniratna-I, Schedule 'A' company, should have obtained an 'excellent' or 'very good' MoU rating in three of the last five years, and must have a composite score of 60 in six performance indicators.
- ✓ For a company to achieve Navratna status, it must report a net profit of more than Rs 5,000 crore for three consecutive years, and maintain an average annual turnover of Rs 25,000 crore for three years, or have an annual average net worth of over Rs 15,000 crore for three years.
- ✓ Navratna companies can achieve 'Maharatna' status by meeting specific performance benchmarks and fulfilling certain eligibility criteria.
- ✓ How does Navratna status benefit PSUs?

- ✓ Navratna PSUs have a comparative advantage over other companies as they have been granted financial independence to invest up to Rs 1,000 crore without seeking approval from the Union government.

- ✓ The Maharatna dispensation was ushered in by the Union government for mega Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) to become global giants (introduced in 2010).

- ✓ CPSEs are those companies in which the direct holding of the Central Government or other CPSEs is 51% or more.
- ✓ "Maharatna" status is granted to a company which has recorded more than Rs. 5,000 crore of net profit for three consecutive years, an average annual turnover of Rs. 25,000 crore for three years or should have an average annual net worth of Rs. 15,000 crore for three years. It should also have global operations or footprints.
