

- ✓ Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) has voted by a 4:2 majority to keep the policy repo rate unchanged at 6.5% for eight consecutive times.
- ✓ This information was provided by the RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das on 7 June 2024 while announcing the second bi-monthly monetary policy of the financial year 2024-25.
- ✓ The second bi-monthly Monetary Policy Committee meeting of fiscal year 2024-25 was held on June 5 to 7, 2024.
- ✓ The next meeting of the MPC is scheduled for 6-8 August 2024.
- ✓ The MPC is mandated to meet at least four times in a financial year, which runs from 1 April to 31 March.
- ✓ Reserve Bank of India has increased the expected growth rate for the Indian economy in 2024-25 to 7.2 per cent.

- ✓ The Monetary Policy Committee was established by the government of India on 29 September 2016 under the Reserve Bank of India Act 1934.
- ✓ The six-member Monetary Policy Committee (MPC), headed by the RBI governor, determines the RBI's policy interest rate required to achieve the inflation target.
- ✓ The members of the Monetary Policy Committee are RBI governor and chairman Shaktikanta Das, deputy governor of RBI Michael Debabrata Patra, Dr Ashima Goyal, Dr Mridul K. Saggar, Dr Shashanka Bhide and Prof. Jayanth R. Verma,
- ✓ The MPC has to meet at least four times in a financial year.
- ✓ The decision in the Monetary Policy Committee is taken by a majority.

- ✓ RBI has proposed setting up an advanced Digital Payments Intelligence Platform to reduce and eliminate online payment fraud risks.

- ✓ Policy Initiatives Announced by the RBI Governor
- ✓ The RBI governor also announced certain initiatives for the banking sector.
- ✓ Bulk term Deposits for Banks raised
- ✓ Banks in India can offer higher interest rates on bulk term deposits. Term deposits refer to Fixed deposits and recurring deposits. Banks offer bulk deposit facilities only for fixed deposits and not for recurring deposits.
- ✓ Now, the RBI has raised the bulk deposit threshold limit for the banks.
- ✓ For Scheduled Commercial Banks and Small Finance Banks, bulk deposit means 'Single Rupee term deposits of Rs3 crore and above'. In 2019, the RBI has increased it from Rs 1 crore to Rs 2 crore.
- ✓ For the Local Area Banks and the Regional Rural Bank, the bulk deposit means a Single Rupee term deposit of Rs1 crore and above.
- ✓ Banks have the power to decide the interest rates on their deposits. There are two types of deposits: demand deposits and Term deposits. Demand deposits include savings accounts and current accounts.

#### **RBI IN NEWS 2024**

- RBI unveils ambitious reform agenda for centenary celebrations in 2035, charts out 14-point action plan.
- > RBI to set up digital payments intel platform after cyber frauds spike over 700%.
- Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Shaktikanta Das has unveiled three major initiatives: the Pravaah portal, the Retail Direct Mobile App, and a FinTech Repository.
- ➤ Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has levied a penalty of Rs 36.38 lakh on HSBC Limited for breaching regulations outlined in the Foreign Exchange Management Act (FEMA).
- RBI imposed penalties on ICICI Bank and YES Bank.
- ➤ ICICI Bank has been fined Rs 1 crore for its improper loan practices.
- > YES Bank has been penalized Rs 91 lakh for charging customers for not maintaining minimum balances in savings accounts.
- ➤ Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has granted approval to Quant Mutual Fund (MF) to increase its stake in RBL Bank to 9.98% by May 12, 2025.
- > RBI has lifted restrictions on Bank of Baroda's BoB World app, allowing immediate customer onboarding.
- Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has issued guidelines for Small Finance Banks (SFBs) seeking to transition into Universal Banks, providing a pathway for conversion.
- To be eligible for conversion, SFBs must have a minimum net worth of Rs 1,000 crore.
- Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has issued a comprehensive master direction for asset reconstruction companies (ARCs), which will come into effect from April 24, 2024.
- ARCs are required to maintain a minimum capital of Rs 300 crore, a significant increase from the previous requirement of Rs 100 crore set on October 11, 2022. Existing ARCs are given a transition period until March 31, 2026, to meet this new minimum requirement.
- ➤ ARCs with a minimum Net Owned Fund (NOF) of Rs 1000 crore are eligible to act as resolution applicants.
- ➤ RBI has imposed a penalty of ₹1 crore on IDFC First Bank for non-compliance with certain directions on 'Loans and Advances Statutory and Other Restrictions'.
- ➤ The central bank has also imposed a penalty of ₹49.7 lakh on LIC Housing Finance for breach of norms.

- ✓ Indo-Pacific Economic Framework for Prosperity (IPEF) Ministerial meeting. The Indian delegation was led by Sunil Barthwal, Secretary of the Department of Commerce.
- ✓ The Indo-Pacific Economic Framework for Prosperity (IPEF) Clean Economy Investor Forum was organised to bring together the Asia Pacific region's top investors, clean economy companies, and startups to mobilise investments into renewable energy projects, sustainable infrastructure and climate technology.
- ✓ IPEF Catalytic Capital Fund
- ✓ The IPEF Catalytic Capital Fund was launched at the forum meeting. The IPEF Catalytic Capital Fund has been set up by IPEF member countries Australia, Japan, the Republic of Korea, and the United States, as well as by a private company, Infrastructure Development Group.
- ✓ These countries have committed to providing USD 33 million as a grant for the fund.
- ✓ The IPEF Catalytic Capital Fund will be managed by the Infrastructure Development Group. The fund seeks to attract up to USD 3.3 billion in private-sector investment in the region's energy projects.
- ✓ About Indo-Pacific Economic Framework for Prosperity (IPEF)
- ✓ The Indo-Pacific Economic Framework for Prosperity (IPEF) is an American-led initiative that was launched after the COVID-19 pandemic, which disrupted the world's supply chain.
- ✓ China, which is the factory of the world, is the crucial link in the global supply chain. Many countries depend on Chinese factories for industrial products, semi-finished products, and raw materials.
- ✓ To diversify from China and build an alternative supply chain, the IPEF was launched.
- ✓ It was formally launched by American President Joe Biden on 23 May 2022 in Tokyo, Japan.
- ✓ The IPEF consists of 14 member countries -The United States of America, India, Australia, Brunei, Fiji, Indonesia, Japan, the Republic of Korea, Malaysia, New Zealand, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam.

- ✓ Four pillars of the IPEF
- ✓ The IPEF is built around four pillars relating to Trade. They are:
- ✓ Pillar -I; Fair and resilient trade (including digital, labour, environmental and other standards);
- ✓ Pillar-2: Supply chain resilience;
- ✓ Pillar-3: Infrastructure, decarbonisation and clean energy; and
- ✓ Pillar-4: Tax and anti-corruption.
- ✓ India has not joined Pillar 1 and has an observer status. However, it has joined Pillars 2, 3, and 4.

- ✓ United Nations General Assembly has elected Pakistan, Somalia, Panama, Denmark, and Greece as the new non-permanent members of the United Nations Security Council. They have been reelected for a two-year term starting 1 January 2025.
- ✓ The election to elect five new members of the UN Security Council was held on 6 June 2024 in the UN's headquarters in New York,the United States of America.
- ✓ The newly elected members Pakistan, Somalia, Panama, Denmark, and Greece will replace Japan, Malta, Mozambique, Ecuador and Switzerland. These countries' terms will end on 31st December 2024.
- ✓ The newly elected members will join Algeria, Guyana, the Republic of Korea, Sierra Leone and Slovenia as the other non-permanent members of the UN Security Council. The terms of Algeria, Guyana, the Republic of Korea, Sierra Leone and Slovenia started on 1 January 2024 and will end on 31st December 2026.
- ✓ The terms of the newly elected Pakistan, Somalia, Panama, Denmark, and Greece will start on 1 January 2025 and end on 31st December 2027.
- ✓ The UN Security Council is the most important body of the United Nations, and it is primarily responsible for maintaining international peace and security. The decision of the Security Council is binding on all the members of the United Nations.

- ✓ It comprises 15 members, 5 of whom are permanent and 10 non-permanent.
- ✓ The five permanent bodies of the UN Security Council are the United States of America, the United Kingdom, France, Russia and China. They have veto power, and if they vote against a resolution in the UN Security Council, then the resolution cannot be passed.
- ✓ The 10 non-permanent members of the UN Security Council are elected for two years and do not have veto power.
- ✓ India and the UN Security Council Membership
- ✓ India has been elected eight times as a non-permanent member of the United Nations Security Council. It was a member in 1950-1951, 1967-1968, 1972-1973, 1977-1978, 1984-1985, 1991-1992, 2011-2012, and 2021-2022.
- ✓ United Nations
- ✓ The United Nations is an international organisation that was formed in 1945 after the League of Nations failed to stop the Second World War.
- ✓ Initially, it consisted of 51 member countries, including India, but now, it has 193 member countries.
- ✓ Secretary General of United Nations: Antonio Guterres
- ✓ Headquarters: New York, the United States of America.
- ✓ Founded:24 October 1945

✓ Bihar's Nagi & Nakti Bird Sanctuaries takes India's Ramsar site to 82

- ✓ Union Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change has notified Nakti and Nagi bird sanctuaries in Bihar as the newest wetlands of international importance under the Ramsar convention. Both the sites are man-made and situated in the Jhajha forest range of Jamui district of Bihar.
- ✓ Bihar now has three wetland sites under the Ramsar convention, and the total number of Ramsar sites in the country has increased to 82.
- ✓ About 81st and 82nd Ramsar Site of India
- ✓ Nagi Bird Sanctuary was notified as the 81st Ramsar Site of India. The Nagi wetland area, spread over 791 hectares in the Jamuai district of Bihar, is a man-made site created by constructing a dam on the Nagi River.
- ✓ Nakti Bird Sanctuary is the 82nd Ramasar site in India. It is also a man-made site created by Nakti Dam and is spread across 332 hectares. It is near the Nagi Bird Sanctuary and is also located in the Jamuai district of Bihar. The dam's lake is a habitat for over 150 species of birds, mammals, fish, aquatic plants, etc.
- ✓ The Nakti wetland was declared a Bird sanctuary in 1984. The Sanctuary has one of the largest congregations of red-crested pochards (Netta rufina) on the Indo-Gangetic plain.
- ✓ Bihar now has three Ramsar sites. The first one was Kanwar Lake in Begusarai district, which was declared a Ramsar site in 2020.
- ✓ India has 3rd largest number of Ramsar Sites in the world
- ✓ India and China jointly hold the third-largest number of Ramsar sites in the world, with 82 sites each.
- ✓ The United Kingdom leads the list with 175 sites, while Mexico is second with 144 sites.
- ✓ What is a Ramsar Site?
- ✓ Ramsar is an Iranian city where an international conference was organised in 1971 to discuss measures and steps to protect wetlands and their fragile ecosystems. An agreement was reached at the conference to protect wetlands around the world.
- ✓ The Conference, which was known as the Ramsar Convention on Wetlands of International Importance, provides a framework for conserving and protecting wetlands worldwide which came into force in 1975.
- ✓ The list is maintained by the Ramsar convention's secretariat, which is based at the International Union for the Conservation of Nature (IUCN) headquarters in Gland, Switzerland.
- ✓ India and Ramsar Convention
- ✓ India ratified the Ramsar Convention in 1982.

- ✓ The first Indian wetland sites included in the Convention were Chilika Lake (Odisha) and Keoladeo National Park (Rajasthan) in 1981.
- ✓ Amongst the states, Tamil Nadu has 16 sites, followed by Uttar Pradesh, which has 10.
- ✓ Largest Ramsar site in India: Sunderban of West Bengal
- ✓ Smallest Ramsar site in India: Renuka in Himachal Pradesh

- ➤ According to the 6th Annual World Air Quality Report, Begusarai has emerged as the most polluted metropolitan area globally in 2023..
- > The Central Government has announced that the Former CM of Bihar Karpoori Thakur will be awarded Bharat Ratna, Highest Civilian Award, posthumously.
- ➤ Karpoori Thakur served twice as CM of Bihar and once as Deputy CM of Bihar.

- ✓ A Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) has been signed for the implementation of a comprehensive Fisheries Management Plan at the 2000 MW Subansiri Lower Hydro Electric Project (SLP) located in Assam.
- ✓ About Subansiri Lower Hydro Electric Project (SLHEP):
- ✓ It is an under-construction gravity dam on the Subansiri River in north-eastern India on the borders of Arunachal Pradesh and Assam, with a capacity of 2000 MW (8x250 MW).
- ✓ It will be the single largest hydroelectric plant in India when completed and is a run-of-river project.
- ✓ The project is being developed by the state-run National Hydro Power Corporation (NHPC).
- ✓ Key Facts about Subansiri River:
- ✓ It is a trans-Himalayan River, and a right-bank tributary of the Brahmaputra River.
- ✓ Also called the Gold River, the Subansiri River is famous for its gold dust.
- ✓ It flows through Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, and the Tibet Autonomous Region of China.

- ✓ About Biopharmaceutical Alliance:

- ✓ It is an alliance of India, South Korea, Japan, the USA and the European Union to put joint efforts into building a resilient supply chain in the biopharmaceutical sector.
- ✓ The participants emphasised the importance of a reliable and sustainable supply chain and agreed to coordinate the respective countries' biopolicies, regulations, and research and development support measures.
- ✓ The alliance was launched in response to the drug supply shortages experienced during the Covid-19 pandemic.
