

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

- ✓ Prithvi: Short-range surface-to-surface ballistic missile.
- ✓ Agni: Medium-range surface-to-surface ballistic missile, i.e., Agni (1,2,3,4,5).
- ✓ Trishul: Short-range surface-to-air missile.
- ✓ Nag: Third-generation anti-tank missile.
- ✓ Akash: Medium-range surface-to-air missile.

#### **DRDO IN NEWS 2025**

- > DRDO in collaboration with the Strategic Forces Command (SFC), has carried out the successful launch of Intermediate Range Agni-Prime Missile from a Rail based Mobile launcher system.
- This next-generation missile is designed to travel up to 2000 kilometers.
- > DRDO conducted two consecutive successful flight-tests of Pralay missile from Dr APJ Abdul Kalam island off the coast of Odisha.
- > The missile has a range of 150-500 km and can be launched from a mobile launcher.
- ➤ The Air Defence unit of the Indian Army conducted a successful user trial of the DRDO developed air defence system, Akash Prime, in Ladakh at an altitude of 15,000 feet.



- ➤ DRDO has successfully conducted the final user trial of the indigenously developed Extended Range Anti-Submarine Rocket (ERASR) from the Indian Naval Ship (INS) Kavaratti.
- ➤ The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has successfully tested its Long-Range Glide Bomb, Gaurav, off the coast of Odisha. The smart bomb was dropped from the Indian Air Force's Su-30 MK-I fighter plane.
- ➤ DRDO has successfully carried out flight-trials of Unmanned Aerial Vehicle Launched Precision Guided Missile (ULPGM)-V3 at the National Open Area Range (NOAR) test range in Kurnool, Andhra Pradesh.
- ➤ DRDO and Indian Air Force (IAF) successfully conducted the flight-test of indigenous Beyond Visual Range Air-to-Air missile (BVRAAM) 'Astra' equipped with indigenous Radio Frequency (RF) Seeker from Su-30 Mk-I platform off the coast of Chandipur, Odisha, on 11 July 2025.
- Astra is a Beyond-Visual-Range Air-to-Air missile (BVRAAM) with a range exceeding 100 kms.

- ✓ This cliff along Kerala's coastline exposes the Warkalli Formation of the Mio-Pliocene age (13 lakh to 2.5 crore years ago), along with natural springs and striking erosional landforms, offering both scientific and touristic value.
- ✓ It is locally called Sivagiri Thuruthu.

✓ It is the 27th national geological monument in the country and the second in Kerala after the Angadipuram Laterite.

#### **UNESCO IN NEWS 2025**

- Ministry of Culture has started consultations to include Chhath Mahaparva in UNESCO's Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity.
- ➤ India has officially nominated the 'Ancient Buddhist Site, Sarnath for the UNESCO World Heritage List under the 2025–26 nomination cycle.
- > United States will again withdraw from the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO).
- > The 'Maratha Military Landscape of India' has become the 44th property of India to be inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List.
- ➤ Uttar Pradesh's Salkhan Fossils Park, located in the Sonbhadra district, has made it to UNESCO's tentative list of World Heritage Sites.
- ➤ The Lakkundi group of monuments in Karnataka is being proposed for inclusion on UNESCO's tentative list of World Heritage Sites.
- ➤ Port Royal, Jamaica, is currently undergoing the nomination process to be inscribed on UNESCO's World Heritage List.
- > The classical ancient Indian texts, Natyashastra and Shrimad Bhagavad Gita, have been inscribed in UNESCO's Memory of the World Register.
- ➤ La Prensa, a Nicaraguan newspaper, was indeed announced as the recipient of the UNESCO/Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom Prize for 2025.
- Two Indian heritage conservation projects—the Abathsahayeswarar Temple Conservation Project in Thukkatchi, Tamil Nadu, and the BJPCI Conservation Project of Mumbai, Maharashtra—have won UNESCO's Asia-Pacific Awards for Cultural Heritage Conservation 2024.
- ➤ UNESCO recently designated 16 new Global Geoparks, increasing the total number of geoparks in its network to 229 across 50 countries.
- > UNESCO and the Indian Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) are collaborating on an AI Readiness Assessment (AI RAM) initiative in India.
- ➤ UNESCO has declared West Bengal as a top destination for heritage tourism.

- ✓ This scheme falls under broader 'Mandatory Testing and Certification of Telecom Equipment (MTCTE)', rules notified in September 2017.
- ✓ These rules have now been superseded by Telecommunications (Framework to Notify Standards, Conformity Assessment and Certification) Rules, 2025.
- ✓ It mandates every OEM/importer/dealer who wishes to sell, import or use any telecom equipment in India, shall have to get their equipment security tested and certified under this scheme.
- ✓ It is also be applicable to such other Telecom Equipment, Hardware, Software or System as notified by the Government.
- ✓ Implementing agency: National Centre for Communication Security (NCCS) is responsible for implementation of this scheme.

- ✓ The DBNet is a global operational framework designed for the real-time acquisition of satellite data from Low Earth Orbit (LEO) satellites.
- ✓ It plays a critical role in Numerical Weather Prediction (NWP) and supports a wide range of applications, including weather forecasting, cyclone monitoring, and climate research.
- ✓ DBNet stations ensure rapid data availability, hence significantly improving the accuracy and timeliness of weather forecasts and related services.
- ✓ The proposed DBNet stations will be capable of receiving direct broadcast data from various existing Indian and international Earth Observing System (EOS) satellites, including Oceansat, NOAA, and MetOp.
- ✓ **Timeliness for NWP:** It provides the near real-time availability of LEO satellite data, which is essential for generating high-resolution, short- to medium-range weather forecasts.
- ✓ **Reduced Data Latency:** DBNet captures data directly as satellites pass overhead, overcoming latency issues and enabling faster data delivery.
