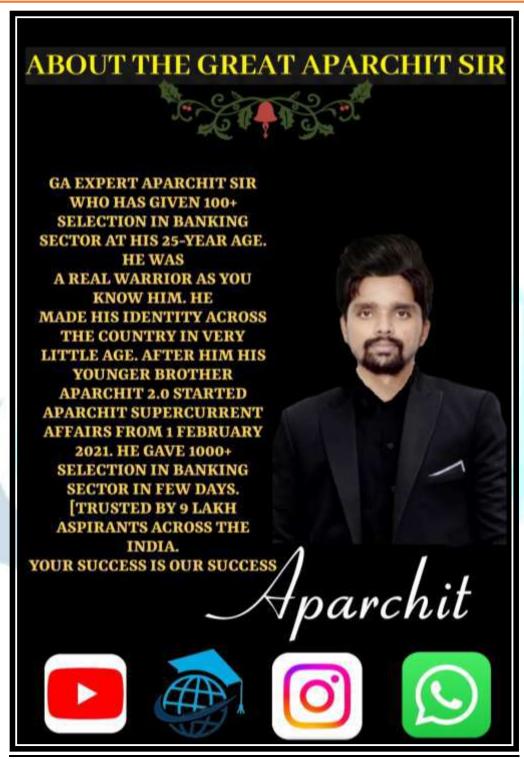

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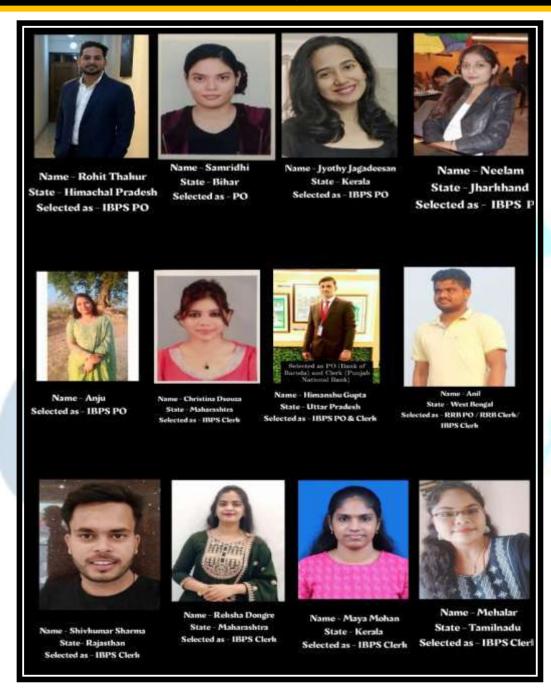

- ✓ PM Modi launched the ₹1 Lakh Crore Research, Development and Innovation (RDI) Scheme Fund while inaugurating the Emerging Science, Technology and Innovation Conclave (ESTIC) 2025 in New Delhi.
- ✓ About the scheme
- ✓ The scheme has an outlay of Rs 1 lakh crore over 6 years, with Rs 20,000 crore allocated for FY 2025–26, funded from the Consolidated Fund of India.
- ✓ The Department of Science and Technology (DST) will serve as the nodal department for implementation of the RDI Scheme.
- ✓ Key objectives of the Scheme are as follows;
- ✓ Encourage the private sector to scale up research, development, and innovation (RDI) in sunrise domains and in other sectors relevant for economic security, strategic purpose, and self-reliance,
- ✓ Finance transformative projects at higher levels of Technology Readiness Levels (TRL),
- ✓ Support acquisition of technologies which are critical or of high strategic importance,
- ✓ Facilitate setting up of a Deep-Tech Fund of Funds.
- ✓ The Governing Board of Anusandhan National Research Foundation (ANRF), chaired by the Prime Minister, will provide overarching strategic direction to the RDI Scheme.



- ✓ India's R&D expenditure has doubled in the last decade, but still remains around 0.7% of GDP, lower than global leaders such as the USA (2.8%) and China (2.4%).
- ✓ The private sector contributes less than 40% of total R&D spending, compared to over 70% in advanced economies.
- ✓ Government Initiatives to Boost R&D
- ✓ **National Research Foundation (NRF):** Aims to enhance research funding and collaboration between academia and industry.
- ✓ **Atal Innovation Mission (AIM):** Encourages startups, entrepreneurship, and innovation among students and professionals.
- ✓ **Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme:** Supports high-tech manufacturing through incentives for R&D-driven industries.
- ✓ Launch of National Missions such as;
- ✓ National Quantum Mission to make India one of the leading nations in the development of Quantum Technologies & Applications (budget outlay: ₹6,003.65 crore),
- ✓ Electric Vehicle-Mission program under ANRF's MAHA (Mission for Advancement in High-impact Areas) programme;
- ✓ India Semiconductor Mission (₹76,000 crore) for building up semiconductor ecosystem in India;
- ✓ Deep Ocean Mission to explore and sustainably utilize the deep ocean's resources (budget outlay: ₹4077 crore);
- ✓ India AI Mission to strengthen AI capabilities (budget outlay: ₹10,372 crore).
- ✓ Introduction of enabling policy frameworks such as the Geospatial Policy 2022, Space Policy 2023, and BioE3 (Biotechnology for Economy, Environment and Employment) Policy 2024.

- ✓ **Categorization:** NGEL has been reclassified as a Schedule 'A' CPSE.
- ✓ **Reason:** The upgrade is due to its growing role, strong performance, and strategic importance in India's renewable energy sector.
- ✓ **Confirmation:** The government notified NGEL of this change through a letter dated October 28, 2025.
- ✓ **Significance:** As a subsidiary of NTPC Limited, NGEL is central to the parent company's renewable energy initiatives and its goal of achieving 60 GW of renewable capacity by 2032.

- ✓ It is India's first defense electric vehicle and among the world's earliest military-use electric tactical vehicles.
- ✓ 'Veer' has successfully passed military trials and has been recognized under the iDEX program of the Ministry of Defense

INDIA'S FIRST IN NEWS 2025

- India's first Central Tissue Bank and a new cashless "We-Office" for the Delhi Dental Council were inaugurated at the Maulana Azad Institute of Dental Sciences (MAIDS), Delhi.
- Agnikul Cosmos Launches India's First Large-Format 3D Printing Facility for Rocket Systems at IIT-Madras.
- > India's first overseas Atal Innovation Centre was inaugurated at the IIT Delhi campus in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates.
- An Assam-based foundation has developed India's first portal for vulture conservation, called The Vulture Network.
- ➤ The portal was launched on September 2, 2025, by We Foundation India in collaboration with Gauhati University's Department of Zoology.
- ➤ BharatPe and Unity Small Finance Bank (Unity Bank) recently launched the Unity Bank BharatPe

Credit Card—India's first EMI-driven credit card on the RuPay network.

- ➤ Kerala has become India's first 100% digitally literate state.
- ➤ Banaras Locomotive Works (BLW) installs India's first detachable solar panels between railway tracks, a milestone in Indian Railways.
- > Gujarat has become the first Indian state to launch a Tribal Genome Sequencing Project.
- > India's first digital nomad village was launched in Yakten, located in the Pakyong district of Sikkim.
- > Fintech firm Slice has pioneered India's first fully UPI-powered bank branch in Bengaluru's Koramangala area
- ➤ Indore Municipal Corporation (IMC) in Madhya Pradesh launched India's first digital house address project.
- India's first wildlife corridor on the Delhi-Mumbai Expressway features the country's longest animal underpass and five overpasses near Ranthambore.
- India's first AI-powered traffic system comes up on Dwarka Expressway in Delhi.
- The ATMS implementation spans the Dwarka Expressway and also a 28-km section of NH-48.
- ➤ Union Minister for Ports, Shipping and Waterways, Sarbananda Sonowal, inaugurated India's first Non-Banking Financial Company-NBFC in the maritime sector, Sagarmala Finance Corporation Limited-SMFCL.
- > Bajaj Allianz Unveils India's First State-Specific Health Insurance Plans.
- Adani Group has commissioned India's first off-grid 5 megawatt green hydrogen pilot plant in Kutch, Gujarat.
- > Ola's Krutrim, an AI unicorn has launched Kruti, which it claims is India's first agentic AI assistant designed to go far beyond conventional chatbots.
- > Tech professional Swathi Nelabhatla has created the Sitha App, which is India's First Women-Exclusive Gig Platform.
- > India's first e-waste recycling park is indeed being developed in Delhi, specifically in Holambi Kalan, North Delhi.
- Andhra Pradesh govt has signed an MoU with the world's largest AI chip maker, NVIDIA, for the establishment of the Artificial Intelligence (AI) University in Amaravati.
- ➤ Kashmir researchers Sher-e-Kashmir University of Agricultural Sciences and Technology (SKUAST) have successfully developed India's first gene-edited sheep.



- EnKash has launched India's first unified payment gateway specifically designed for small and medium businesses (SMBs) and startups. This new platform, called the EnKash Payment Gateway.
- ➤ India's first manned deep ocean mission 'Samudrayaan' into a 6,000-metre depth using the manned submersible vehicle 'Matsya' is expected to be launched by the end of 2026.
- ➤ India's first privately built geostationary orbit (GSO) communication satellite is expected to be ready by 2028. Ananth Technologies, an Indian private firm, is developing this satellite.
- Rajasthan is indeed joining Madhya Pradesh in India's first cheetah reintroduction project.
- > This corridor will link Palpur Kuno National Park and Gandhi Sagar Sanctuary in Madhya Pradesh with Mukundara Hills Tiger Reserve in Rajasthan.

- ✓ Bharat International Rice Conference (BIRC 2025), the world's largest platform dedicated to the rice industry, was held at Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi, Delhi from October 30 to October 31, 2025.
- ✓ The two-day conference was chaired by Union Minister Piyush Goyal, Ministry of Commerce & Industry(MoC&I), Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food & Public Distribution(MoCAF&PD), brought together stakeholders from over 80 countries.
- ✓ The conference aims to tap Rs 1.80 lakh crore in new rice import markets, and sign exports MoUs worth Rs 25,000 crore.
- ✓ BIRC 2025 was organised by the Indian Rice Exporters' Federation (IREF), apex body of rice which represents more than 75,000 exporters and allied stakeholders in India; in collaboration with the Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority (APEDA) under the Ministry of Commerce & Industry (MoC&I), which provided the non-financial support to the event.
- ✓ The Rice Exporters Association, Chhattisgarh (TREA-CG) and the Rice Exporters Association (TERA), Kakinada, Andhra Pradesh(AP) were the co-partners of the event.



- ✓ The event featured a dedicated 'AgriTech Pavilion' showcasing India's first Artificial Intelligence(AI)-based rice sorting technology, launched live during the inaugural session, marking a major step toward next-generation agricultural precision.
- ✓ India produced around 150 million tonnes(MT) of rice in 2024–25 from nearly 47 million hectares, representing about 28% of the world's total rice output.
- ✓ APEDA operates under the Ministry of Commerce and Industry and was established in 1985 to promote exports of agricultural and processed food products

- ✓ MYGS Portal and a Teacher Training Module were unveiled to support the initiative's nationwide implementation.
- ✓ About Model Youth Gram Sabha (MYGS).
- ✓ The MYGS, aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the vision of Viksit Bharat.



- ✓ The MYGS will be rolled out in a phased manner across more than 1,000 schools nationwide, including Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas (JNVs), Eklavya Model Residential Schools (EMRSs), and State Government Schools.
- ✓ An amount of Rs. 20,000 per school will be provided to each participating school as a one-time financial assistance for conducting each mock.

- ✓ On November 1, 2025, Employees' Provident Fund Organization (EPFO), Ministry of Labour and Employment (MoL&E), celebrated its 73rd Foundation Day at Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi, Delhi.
- ✓ On the occasion of EPFO Foundation Day 2025, Union Minister Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya launched the Employee Enrollment Scheme 2025, designed to encourage employers to voluntarily declare and enrol eligible employees under the Employees' Provident Fund (EPF).
- ✓ The scheme, operational from 1st November 2025, exempts employers from paying the employee's share of contributions if it was not deducted earlier and imposes only a nominal penalty of Rs.100 per establishment.
- ✓ He also unveiled the revamped EPFO homepage with a new user-friendly domain www.epfo.gov.in featuring improved interface, intuitive navigation, and simplified access to essential services and information for members, employers, and pensioners.

✓ Union Minister Jyotiraditya Madhavrao Scindia, Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (MDoNER) and Ministry of Communications (MoC) along with Meghalaya Chief Minister (CM) Conrad K. Sangma, laid the foundation stone for the Integrated Development of the Sohra (Cherrapunji) Tourism Circuit in Sohra, Meghalaya.



- ✓ The project, funded under the Prime Minister's Development Initiative for North East Region (PM-DevINE) scheme, aims to transform Sohra into a model for sustainable and community-led tourism in the Northeast.
- ✓ About the Sohra Tourism Circuit Project:
- ✓ To transform Sohra (Cherrapunji) into a multi-day experiential tourism destination by strengthening infrastructure, boosting local livelihoods, and preserving cultural and ecological heritage.
- ✓ The project entails a total investment of over Rs. 650 crore, including Rs. 221 crore contributed by the MDoNER.
- ✓ Key Project Components:
- ✓ **Sohra Experience Centre at Kutmadan:** Developed with an investment of Rs. Rs. 115 crore, the centre features an amphitheatre, rain experience park, art gallery, and craft pavilion showcasing Meghalaya's rich tribal heritage.
- ✓ **Nohkalikai Falls Precinct Development:** The project focuses on enhancing visitor facilities and enriching the overall tourist experience, with an estimated investment of Rs. 26 crore.
- ✓ **Mawsmai Eco Park Development:** The project is aimed at promoting sustainable tourism and fostering environmental awareness, with an estimated investment of Rs. 29 crore
- ✓ About Prime Minister's Development Initiative for North East Region (PM-DevINE) Scheme.
- ✓ The PM-DevINE Scheme is a Central Sector Scheme (CSS) launched in the Union Budget 2022–23 by the Government of India (GoI) in 2022 to fund infrastructure and social development projects in the North Eastern Region (NER) of India.
- ✓ **Implementing**: It is implemented through the Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (MDoNER).
- ✓ Coverage: All eight North Eastern States Arunachal Pradesh (AP), Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim, and Tripura.
- ✓ **Outlay :** Rs. 6,600 crore (for 2022–23 to 2025–26)

- ✓ ISRO Signs MoU with BCCL, CMPDI to map Coal Fires in Jharia Coalfield.
- ✓ Indian Space Research Organization(ISRO) entered into a tripartite agreement with Bharat Coking Coal Limited (BCCL) and Central Mine Planning & Design Institute Limited(CMPDI) to carry out a detailed study on surface coal fires and related land subsidence in the Jharia Coalfield, Jharkhand, to be implemented during Financial Year(FY) 2025–27.
- ✓ Under the project, ISRO's National Remote Sensing Centre (NRSC) will use satellite-based remote sensing with Thermal Infrared (TIR) and Short-Wave Infrared (SWIR) data quarterly to map coal fires.
- ✓ It will also apply Synthetic Aperture Radar (SAR) interferometric techniques annually using data from the NISAR(National Aeronautics and Space Administration(NASA)-ISRO synthetic Aperture Radar) and Sentinel-1 satellites to monitor land subsidence.

ISRO IN NEWS 2025

- ➤ ISRO, NewSpace India Limited (NSIL), IN-SPACe, and Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) signed a landmark technology transfer deal on September 10, 2025, for ISRO's Small Satellite Launch Vehicle (SSLV).
- ➤ ISRO successfully completed its first Integrated Air Drop Test (IADT-1), which is an important milestone in the preparations for the country's first human spaceflight program, Gaganyaan, on August 24, 2025, at Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh.
- > ISRO to launch Block 2 BlueBird satellite in 3-4 months, following successful NISAR mission with NASA.
- ➤ About Bluebird Satellite



- ➤ It is an advanced American communications satellite.
- ➤ It was developed by the U.S.-based AST SpaceMobile.
- ➤ ISRO has inaugurated the Himalayan Outpost for Planetary Exploration (HOPE) space analog mission at Tso Kar Valley (Ladakh) to simulate and study challenges linked to long-duration space missions at 14,000 feet in Ladakh.
- India aims to set up its own space station by 2035 and conduct a crewed Moon landing by 2040.
- ➤ ISRO launched the NASA–ISRO Synthetic Aperture Radar (NISAR) satellite using the GSLV-F16 rocket from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre at Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh.
- Mission Life: Designed for minimum 3 years mission life for Earth-Observation (Radar Imaging).
- ➤ Orbital Details: NISAR to orbit Earth at 747km altitude in Sun-Synchronous (Low Earth) Orbit with a repeat cycle of 12 days
- ➤ ISRO plans to launch three navigation satellites by 2026 as part of its Indian Regional Navigation Satellite System (IRNSS), also known as NavIC (Navigation with Indian Constellation).
- ➤ The new satellites, designated NVS-03, NVS-04, and NVS-05.
- NavIC is designed to be interoperable with other global navigation satellite systems (GNSS) like GPS (USA), GLONASS (Russia), Galileo (EU), and BeiDou (China).
- ➤ The Cabinet Committee approved \$3.2 billion for the SBS-III programme to develop next-generation satellites over the next decade. Under the programme, ISRO will manufacture and launch the first 21 satellites.
- > ISRO conducted two short-duration hot tests of the Gaganyaan Service Module Propulsion System (SMPS).
- The tests were carried out at the ISRO Propulsion Complex (IPRC) in Mahendragiri, Tamil Nadu.
- ➤ ISRO's 63rd PSLV mission (PSLV-C61/EOS-09) failed due to a technical malfunction during the third stage of the PSLV rocket.
- > Since its first flight, Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV) has failed only twice inaugural flight in 1993 and again in 2017.
- ➤ ISRO's 101st launch using PSLV-C61 failed mid-flight, due to a chamber pressure drop during the third stage. The mission aimed to place EOS-09 in Sun Synchronous Polar Orbit.
- > ISRO has successfully developed an indigenous Stellite nozzle divergent for the PSLV's fourth stage, replacing the previously imported Columbium and significantly reducing import costs by 90%.



- ➤ ISRO achieved its historic 100th launch from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre (SDSC) in Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh using the GSLV-F15 to deploy the NVS-02 satellite.
- NVS-02 is the 2nd satellite in the series of 2nd generation satellites of the Navigation with Indian Constellation (NavIC).
- ➤ The GSLV-F15 is the 17th GSLV flight, and 11th with an Indigenous Cryogenic stage.
- ➤ Union Cabinet approved the establishment of the Third Launch Pad (TLP) at Satish Dhawan Space Centre of Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) at Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh.
- ➤ The government of India has appointed V. Narayanan as the 11th chairman of ISRO and secretary of the Department of Space (DOS).
- ➤ He will succeed the current chairman S.Somanth
- ➤ Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO)
- Founded: 15 August 1969
- > HQ : Bengalore, Karnataka
- Founder / 1st Chairman : Vikram Sarabhai
- > 11th Chairman : V. Narayanan
- Aryabhata India's first satellites Launched on 19 April 1975.
- ➤ GSAT-1 India's first commercial satellite.

- ✓ Gogabeel Lake in Bihar Designated as India's 94th Ramsar Site.
- ✓ Gogabeel Lake in Katihar district of Bihar has been officially designated as Ramsar Convention Sites of International Importance, bringing the total number of internationally recognised Ramsar sites in India to 94.



- ✓ With this addition, Bihar now has six Ramsar Sites, ranking third in India after Tamil Nadu(TN) (20 sites) and Uttar Pradesh(UP) (10 sites).
- ✓ India now hosts 94 Ramsar sites, covering a total area of 13,60,805 hectares.
- ✓ India holds the highest number of Ramsar Sites in South Asia and ranks first in Asia, while globally, it stands third, after the United Kingdom(UK) (176 sites) and Mexico (144 sites).
- ✓ Before Gogabeel Lake, Gokul Jalashay (448 ha) in Buxar district and Udaipur Jheel (319 ha) in West Champaran district were designated as India's 92nd and 93rd Ramsar Sites, respectively.
- ✓ Bihar has six Ramsar sites.
- ✓ 6. Gogabeel Lake: Located in Katihar district.
- ✓ 5. Gokul Jalashay: An oxbow lake in Buxar district.
- ✓ 4. Udaipur Jheel: An oxbow lake in West Champaran district.
- ✓ 3. Nagi Bird Sanctuary: In Jamui district.
- ✓ 2. Nakti Bird Sanctuary: In Jamui district.
- ✓ 1. Kanwar Jheel: Also known as Kabartal Wetland, located in Begusarai district.
