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

- ✓ Government of India (GoI) granted Geographical Indication (GI) registration for Sikkim's two traditional Lepcha musical instruments namely, 'Tungbuk' and 'Pumtong Pulin' under the "Musical Instrument" category of the Geographical Indication Registry (GIR).
- ✓ **Tungbuk:** It is a three-string instrument made of softwood and parchment. This musical instrument is 36 inches in length, with a diameter of 11 inches and a height of 6 inches
- ✓ **Pumtong Pulin:** It is a four hole Bamboo flute, specifically used to replicate the sound of nature

- GoI Granted GI Tag to Sikkim's Lepcha Musical Instruments 'Tungbuk' and 'Pumtong Pulin'.



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- Meghalaya's indigenous textile 'Ryndia' has received the GI tag for its organic, handwoven, and naturally dyed fabric.
- Warangal Chapata Chilli, also known as Tomato Chilli, has been granted a Geographical Indication (GI) tag, recognizing its unique qualities and regional significance in Telangana.
- Kannadippaya, a traditional tribal handicraft from Kerala, has been awarded the Geographical Indication (GI) tag.
- Kumbakonam betel leaf, grown in the fertile Cauvery river basin of Thanjavur, has been granted a Geographical Indication (GI) Tag by the Government of India.
- The Saudagari block print, a traditional textile art form, has been officially granted a Geographical Indication (GI) tag.
- This craft is practised by artisans in Jamalpur, Ahmedabad, and has been preserved for nearly 300 years
- A consignment of 30 tonnes of Geographical Indication (GI)-tagged jaggery from Muzaffarnagar, Uttar Pradesh, has been shipped to Bangladesh.
- Meghalaya's Eri Silk, known locally as Ryndia silk, recently received a Geographical Indication (GI) tag in 2025.
- Rajasthan's famous sangri bean from the Thar Desert received the prestigious Geographical Indication (GI) tag.
- Rajasthan's famous dish, Ker Sangri, has recently received a Geographical Indication (GI) tag.
- Chanderi sarees and Maheshwari sarees from Madhya Pradesh have received Geographical Indication (GI) tag.
- The Government of India has set a target of 10,000 Geographical Indication (GI) tags for the Indian products by 2030.
- Virgin Coconut Oil (VCO) from Nicobar district in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands was recently awarded the prestigious Geographical Indication (GI) tag.
- Marble mined in Gujarat's Ambaji has recently been awarded the Geographical Indication, or GI tag, by the Central Government.
- **GEOGRAPHICAL INDICATIONS (GI) :-**
- GI tags are issued as per the Geographical Indications of Goods (Registration and Protection) Act, 1999. This tag is issued by the Geographical Indication Registry under the Department of



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Industry Promotion and Internal Trade, Ministry of Commerce and Industry.

- Darjeeling Tea was the first Indian product to get the geographical indication tag in 2004.
- The second GI tag in India was given to Aranmula Kannadi (Handicraft) which is a mirror and made in Kerala.
- A GI is registered for an initial period of ten years, which must be renewed after 10 years.

- ✓ The four-year astronaut training programme in Florida (the United States of America, USA) spans from 2025 to 2029, with the physical training component scheduled between 2026 and 2029.
- ✓ Guided by experts including National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) veteran William McArthur and Brazil's first astronaut Marcos Pontes.

Q.4. As per the Public Sector Banks Review Meeting, what was the combined net profit of Public Sector Banks during April–September 2025?

- ✓ The Public Sector Banks (PSBs) Review Meeting was chaired by M. Nagaraju, Secretary, Department of Financial Services (DFS), Ministry of Finance in New Delhi.
- ✓ PSBs reported a combined net profit of ₹93,675 crore (April–September 2025), showing nearly 10% year-on-year growth.
- ✓ Gross Non-Performing Assets (NPAs) fell to 2.3% and Net Non-Performing Assets (NPAs) to 0.45%, reflecting improved asset quality.



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- ✓ Aggregate business rose to ₹261 lakh crore, with advances up 12.3% and deposits up 9.6%.
- ✓ The meeting reviewed risk management, underwriting practices, and operational resilience in evolving financial conditions.
- ✓ It highlighted Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) and agriculture sector credit growth, plus digital adoption with Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools like BAANKNET for loan recovery.
- ✓ Initiatives such as the Startup Common Application Journey on Jan Sammarth Portal and the PSB Manthan 2025 roadmap were discussed for future growth

- ✓ The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) issued the Master Direction – Repurchase Transactions (Repo) Directions, 2025 under Section 45W of the RBI Act, 1934.
- ✓ These directions update the earlier 2018 framework and expand the list of eligible collateral.
- ✓ For the first time, Municipal Debt Securities have been included along with Government Securities, corporate bonds, Commercial Papers (CPs), Certificates of Deposit (CDs), and Debt Exchange Traded Funds (ETFs).
- ✓ The rules apply to repos conducted on stock exchanges, electronic trading platforms, and OTC markets, but exclude RBI's Liquidity Adjustment Facility (LAF) and Marginal Standing Facility (MSF).
- ✓ They define norms for tenor, tri-party repo systems, reporting, settlement, pricing, haircuts, accounting, and compliance.

RBI IN NEWS 2025

- RBI has significantly revised its lending norms for IPO financing and Loans Against Shares (LAS), increasing the IPO limit from ₹10 lakh to ₹25 lakh and the LAS limit from ₹20 lakh to ₹1 crore per person.
- FACE appoints ex-RBI executive Manoranjan Mishra as independent director.
- Fintech Association for Consumer Empowerment (FACE), a self-regulatory body for fintechs in the country.
- RBI extended the period for foreign currency payment or expenditure for Merchanting Trade



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Transactions (MTT) from four months to six months.

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) is taking important steps to make the Indian Rupee (INR) more global with India's neighbouring countries like Bangladesh, Bhutan, Nepal, and Sri Lanka.
- **Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has decided to give a glide path of four years starting 1 April, 2027 for expected credit loss (ECL) norms.**
- ECL norms will not be applicable for Small Finance Banks (SFBs), Payment Banks (PBs), Regional Rural Banks (RRBs) and All India Financial Institutions (AIFIs).
- Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has withdrawn its 2016 circular, the "Guidelines on Enhancing Credit Supply for Large Borrowers through Market Mechanism,".
- The withdrawal took effect on April 1, 2026.
- As per the circular, the threshold of credit exposure to a borrower by the banking system was reduced from Rs 25,000 cr in FY18 to Rs 15,000 cr in FY19, and to Rs 10,000 cr from FY20.
- RBI has ordered Simpl, a Bengaluru based buy -now- pay- later(BNPL) firm, to shut its payment operations with immediate effect.
- Reserve Bank of India (RBI) issued new authentication rules for digital payments, effective April 1, 2026, which mandate two-factor authentication (2FA).
- Outward remittances by Indian residents under the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) Liberalised Remittance Scheme (LRS) decreased by nearly 11% year-on-year in July 2025, reaching \$2,452.93 million from \$2,754.05 million in July 2024.
- Indian government will route funds for all Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSS), with a total annual budget of Rs 5 lakh crore, directly through the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to State Nodal Agencies (SNA).
- RBI has constituted a Regulatory Review Cell (RRC) as part of its efforts to strengthen the institutional mechanism for review of regulations.
- The mandate of the RRC, headed by State Bank of India Managing Director Rana Ashutosh Kumar Singh.
- DBS Bank India is the first wholly-owned subsidiary of a foreign bank in India to be authorized by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to collect Goods and Services Tax (GST) payments.
- The 32nd meeting of the sub-committee of the Financial Stability and Development Council (FSDC) was chaired by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) governor, Sanjay Malhotra, to discuss economic



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challenges due to US tariffs, KYC simplification, and measures for financial inclusion.

- Former Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Urjit Patel has been appointed as executive director at the International Monetary Fund(IMF).
- Urjit Patel served as the 24th Governor of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) from September 2016 to December 2018.
- RBI has granted 'in- principle' approval to Aditya Birla Capital Digital (ABCD), the digital arm of Aditya Birla Capital, to act as an online payment aggregator under the payment and settlement System Act 2007
- The RBI's FREE-AI (Framework for Responsible and Ethical Enablement of Artificial Intelligence) Committee recommends that the Indian financial sector adopt a dual approach to AI, fostering innovation and mitigating risks together rather than in opposition.
- This framework is built on seven principles (Sutras) and six strategic pillars—three for innovation (Infrastructure, Policy, Capacity) and three for risk mitigation (Governance, Protection, Assurance)—and includes 26 actionable recommendations to guide ethical and inclusive AI development in finance.
- Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has approved the nomination of Executive Director Indranil Bhattacharyya as an ex officio member of the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC).

- ✓ The exercise emphasized Military-Civil Fusion and the Whole-of-Nation approach to defence preparedness.

- Exercise Brahmashira 2025 was conducted from 11–13 November 2025 in the Rann and Creek sector of Gujarat under the Tri-Services Exercise Trishul.
- The 6th edition of Vietnam-India Bilateral Army Exercise (VINBAX), a bilateral military exercise between India and Vietnam, began on November 11, 2025, at the National Military Training Centre 4 in Hanoi, Vietnam.
- The 29th edition of the multilateral Exercise Malabar(2025) began at Guam in the Northern Pacific Ocean (NPO), hosted by the United States of America (USA).
- The 11th edition of India-Sri Lanka joint Military Exercise MITRA SHAKTI-2025 began at the Foreign Training Node, Belagavi, Karnataka, on 10 November 2025 and will continue till 23 November 2025.

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concluded in France.

- The 6th edition of Exercise DUSTLIK, a bilateral joint military drill between India and Uzbekistan, commenced on April 16, 2025, at the Foreign Training Node, Aundh, Pune, Maharashtra.
- The eighth edition of the bilateral Indo-French military exercise 'Shakti' begins on June 18, 2025, Camp Larzac, La Cavalerie in France.
- The first-ever joint special operations exercise between the Indian Air Force and the US Air Force, named "Tiger Claw," took place from May 26 to June 10, 2025.

- ✓ **About Maria Corina Machado.**
- ✓ National Coordinator of Vente Venezuela, a liberal political party she co-founded in 2013, and former Member of the National Assembly (2010-2015).



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- ✓ **Awards & Recognition:** Named among British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC's) 100 Most Influential Women (2018), recipient of the Charles T. Manatt Prize (2014), Libertad Cortes de Cádiz (2015), and the Liberal International Freedom Prize (2019).
- ✓ The total cash prize for 2025 is 11 million Swedish kronor (SEK), approximately USD 1.2 million.
- ✓ The International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) has won the Nobel Peace Prize three times, while the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) has received it twice.

- ✓ The total cash prize for 2025 is 11 million Swedish kronor (SEK) was awarded half to Joel Mokyr and half jointly to Philippe Aghion and Peter Howitt.
- ✓ **❖ MOST IMPORTANT SURPRISE FACTS NOBEL PRIZE**
- ✓ ◆ Established : 1901
- ✓ ◆ First awarded : 1901
- ✓ ◆ The prizes are given in 6 categories which are - Economic Sciences, Chemistry, Literature, Peace, Physics and Physiology or Medicine.
- ✓ ◆ Country : Sweden (all prizes except the Peace Prize); Norway (Peace Prize only)
- ✓ ◆ Memory of Sir Alfred Nobel (Sweden) founder of the Nobel Prize (invention of dynamite)
- ✓ ◆ Economic Science Nobel Prize established : 1969



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- ✓ ◇ Malala Yousafzai is the youngest Nobel Laureates who got the Peace Prize in 2014 at the age of just 17 years with Kailash Satyarthi.
- ✓ ◇ John B. Goodenough is the oldest person to receive a Nobel Prize, winning the 2019 Nobel Prize in Chemistry at the age of 97.
- ✓ ◇ John Bardeen is the only Nobel Laureate who has been awarded the Nobel Prize in Physics twice, in 1956 and 1972.
- ✓ ◇ Marie Curie is the only one woman who has been honoured twice, with the 1903 Nobel Prize in Physics and the 1911 Nobel Prize in Chemistry.
- ✓ ◇ Frederick Sanger is the only Nobel Laureate who has been awarded the Nobel Prize in Chemistry twice, in 1958 and 1980
- ✓ ◇ Switzerland-based International Committee of the Red Cross is the only 3-time recipient of the Nobel Prize, being conferred with Peace Prize in 1917, 1944, and 1963.
- ✓ ◇ The Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees has been awarded the Nobel Peace Prize two times (in 1954 and 1981).
- ✓ ◇ Rabindra Nath Tagore was the first Indian to receive the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1913 for his poetry collection Gitanjali.
- ✓ ◇ Nobel Prize categories are physics, chemistry, medicine, literature, peace and economics, the last being introduced in 1968.
- ✓ ◇ Linus Pauling is the only person to have been awarded two unshared Nobel Prizes – the 1954 Nobel Prize in Chemistry and the 1962 Nobel Peace Prize


