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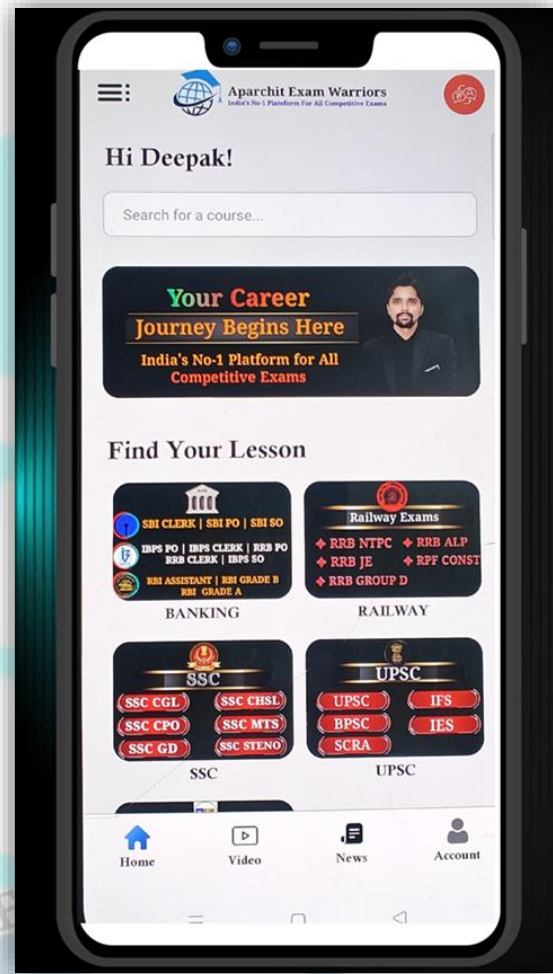
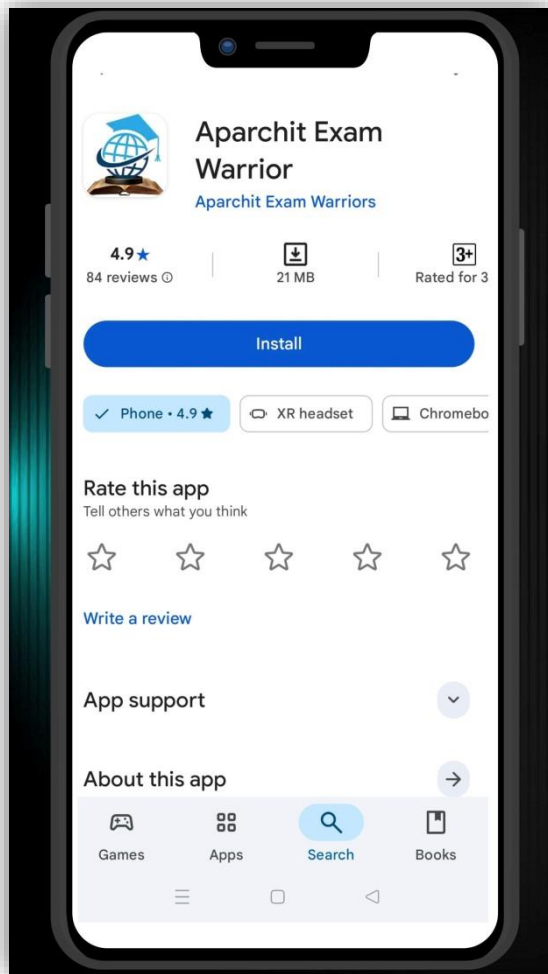

Often called the "Green Nobel," this annual award honours grassroots leaders from the six inhabited continental regions for their extraordinary efforts to protect the environment.
- 2026 Prize Winners & Achievements.**
 - Iroro Tanshi (Nigeria, Africa):** Led community efforts to protect the Afi Mountain Wildlife



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Sanctuary and conserve the endangered short-tailed round leaf bat.

2. **Borim Kim (South Korea, Asia):** Spearheaded South Korea's first successful youth climate lawsuit, forcing stronger government emissions targets.

3. **Sarah Finch (United Kingdom, Europe):** Secured a landmark UK Supreme Court ruling necessitating consideration of "downstream" emissions for new fossil fuel projects.

4. **Theonila Roka Matbob (Papua New Guinea, Islands):** Compelled mining corporations to address environmental damages from the long-abandoned Panguna mine.

6. **Yuvelis Morales Blanco (Colombia, South & Central America):** Organized youth movements that halted commercial fracking in the Magdalena River region.

- About **Goldman Environmental Prize Established:** 1989 by Richard and Rhoda Goldman.
- **Alternative Name:** Widely known as the "**Green Nobel Prize**". **Mandate:** Recognises grassroots activists from the six inhabited continental regions: Africa, Asia, Europe, Islands & Island Nations, North America, and South & Central America. The winners are selected by an international jury and awarded USD 200,000 as prize money.
- The Prize recognizes individuals for sustained and significant efforts to protect and enhance the natural environment, often at great personal risk. The first Goldman Environmental Prize ceremony took place on April 16, 1990. It was timed to coincide with Earth Day.
- The **winners are announced on Earth Day** which is observed on **22nd April every year**.
- **Indian Recipients of the Goldman Environmental Prize:**
- **Alok Shukla (2024):** Recognized for his role in organizing local communities against 21 proposed coal mines in Chhattisgarh.
- **Prafulla Samantra (2017):** Fought against bauxite mining in Niyamgiri hills, Odisha.
- **Ramesh Agrawal (2014):** Organised villagers against coal mining in Chhattisgarh.
- **Rashida Bee and Champa Devi Shukla (2004):** Fought for victims of the Bhopal Gas Tragedy.
- **Medha Patkar (1992):** Key figure in the Narmada Bachao Andolan.

- This recognition capped a historic period where he became the youngest male player in history to complete a Career Grand Slam at age 22. He is the fourth tennis player to win the award, joining Roger Federer, Rafael Nadal, and Novak Djokovic.
- **Previous Laureus Honors:** In 2023, he received the **Laureus World Breakthrough of the Year** award after his first US Open title and rise to World No. 1.
- **World No. 1 Milestone:** At age 19, he became the youngest-ever World No. 1 in ATP history after winning the 2022 US Open.

She is one of only a few tennis players to receive the honour, joining legends like Serena Williams and Naomi Osaka. She has won **4 Grand Slam singles titles** in her career.

The **Laureus World Sports Awards**, often called the "Oscars of Sport," were established in **1999** by the Laureus Sport for Good Foundation, founded by patrons **Daimler** and **Richemont**. Sachin Tendulkar is the only Indian to win a Laureus World Sports Award, securing the "Laureus Sporting Moment 2000–2020" in 2020.

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) issued the **Digital Payments – E-mandate Framework, 2026** on April 21, 2026. This framework consolidates existing instructions and introduces refined rules for recurring digital payments.
- **Key Facts of the 2026 Framework**
- **Mandatory One-Time Registration:** Customers must complete a one-time registration validated via an **Additional Factor of Authentication (AFA)** for all e-mandates.
- **Tiered AFA-Free Limits: ₹15,000:** The standard threshold for recurring transactions that can be processed without repeated OTPs once the mandate is set.
- **₹1,00,000:** A higher limit for specific essential categories—**insurance premiums, mutual fund subscriptions, and credit card bill payments**—allowing them to proceed without AFA.



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- **Pre-transaction Notifications:** Issuers must send a detailed alert to the customer at least **24 hours before** the actual debit.
- *Exemptions:* Auto-replenishments for **FASTag** and **National Common Mobility Card (NCCM)** balances do not require these pre-debit notifications.
- **Zero Charges:** Banks and payment service providers are prohibited from charging customers for registering or availing e-mandate facilities for recurring transactions.
- **Customer Control:** Users can modify, pause, or revoke mandates at any time, though any modification or withdrawal requires fresh AFA validation.
- **Card Continuity:** Existing e-mandates on cards can be mapped to reissued cards to ensure uninterrupted recurring payments.

- This newly designated wetland marks India's 99th Ramsar site and the 12th such site for the state of Uttar Pradesh.
- **Key Facts about Shekha Jheel Bird Sanctuary**
- **Location:** Situated near Shekha village in Aligarh district, Uttar Pradesh.
- **Origin:** A perennial freshwater body that formed after the construction of the Upper Ganges Canal in 1852, which flows adjacent to the lake.
- **Biodiversity:** Hosts over **180 migratory bird species** during winter, including the Bar-headed Goose, Painted Stork, and various ducks



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RAMSAR SITE IN NEWS 2025-26

- ☞ Shekha Jheel Bird Sanctuary in Aligarh, Uttar Pradesh, has been designated as a Ramsar site, marking it as India's 99th and Uttar Pradesh's 12th such wetland of international importance.
- ☞ Patna Bird Sanctuary in Uttar Pradesh's Etah and Chhari-Dhand in Gujarat's Kutch have been recognised as Ramsar sites. The designation of these two sites under the Ramsar Convention takes the total number of such wetlands in India to 98.
- ☞ Siliserh Lake in Alwar has been declared as the fifth Ramsar site in Rajasthan and 96th in the country.
- ☞ Kopra reservoir in Bilaspur district in Chhattisgarh has been designated as a Ramsar Site. With this, Chhattisgarh got its first Ramsar Site.
- ☞ Gogabeel Lake is a vital oxbow lake in Bihar's Katihar district, recently designated as India's 94th Ramsar Site.
- ☞ India has designated two new Ramsar Sites in Bihar – Gokul Jalashay (448 ha) in Buxar and Udaipur Jheel (319 ha) in West Champaran. With this, India now has 93 Ramsar Sites
- ☞ Two wetlands in Rajasthan, Khichan in Phalodi and Menar in Udaipur, were designated as Ramsar Sites in June 2025, bringing India's total to 91 and making it the highest in Asia.
- ☞ India added four new wetlands to the Ramsar List in early 2025, increasing its total to 89 sites. The new additions are Sakkarakottai Bird Sanctuary and Therthangal Bird Sanctuary in Tamil Nadu, Khecheopalri Wetland in Sikkim, and Udhwa Lake in Jharkhand.
- ☞ 15th Conference of the Parties to the Ramsar Convention on Wetlands (COP15) took place from July 23-31, 2025, in Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe
- ☞ About Ramsar Sites:
 - ☞ Wetland sites of international importance under the Ramsar Convention (1971), promoting conservation and sustainable use.
 - ☞ Origin: Signed in Ramsar, Iran (1971); came into force in 1975 under UNESCO.
 - ☞ Aim: Protect wetlands as critical ecosystems for biodiversity, water security, flood control, and livelihoods.
- ☞ India and Ramsar Sites:

- ☞ Asia: 1st in number of Ramsar sites
- ☞ Ramsar Convention and India India joined the Ramsar Convention by ratifying it on 1 February 1982.

- ☞ Tamil Nadu has a maximum of 20 sites.
- ☞ Largest Ramsar site: Sunderban of West Bengal (423,000 hectares). Declared Ramsar Site in 2019.
- ☞ Smallest Ramsar: Renuka in Himachal Pradesh (20 hectares). Declared a Ramsar site in 2005.

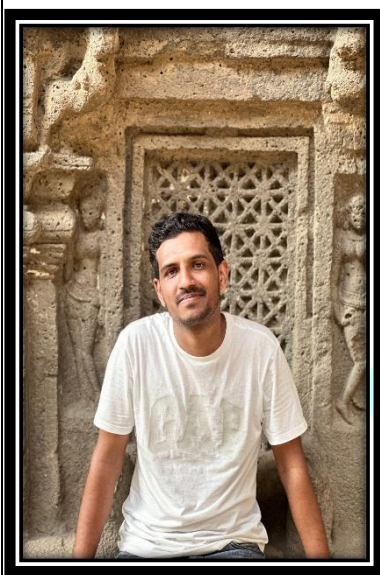

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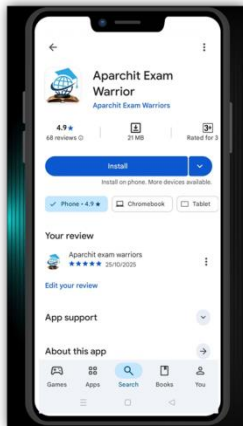
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
